

- ◆ We've had a few early registrations this year, but still await the majority of renewals. Do remember that your application form and payment must be in by no later than March 31. We appreciate your timely response which makes it possible to pay our bills and keep the membership lists up to date. There is a late payment penalty for tardy responses.
- •A reminder that we have limited space for keeping trailers; therefore the club does **not** offer long term boat storage, only summer dry docking for boats that are put in and out of the water each time they are used during the season. We can arrange for some assistance if it is needed when moving boats.
- The entry codes for the clubhouse and the launch ramp chain will be changed once again this year. Please do not share this information with anyone

- other than the family members you register. Last season we experienced some unauthorized use of the launch ramp which is unfair to paying members and potentially damaging to the ramp.
- Please note that stored boats and/or trailers may be moved periodically in order to cut overgrown grasses and keep the grounds looking neat and tidy.

Welcome to another great season of sailing and boating on the Ottawa River!

Last summer we began a weekly Wednesday evening sailing program which provided a chance for us to get out on the river as a group. We plan to keep it going this season, perhaps with the addition of defining a race course to hone our skills and establish handicaps. As well, we are looking at adding a couple more races to complement our annual August regatta.

One of the challenges of racing in our club has been the diversity of hull types and sizes in our fleet. To that end we hope to introduce a handicap system to even things up, as well as looking at a variety of race formats. These could include a chase style starts, where boats begin the race according to handicap with the objective of having a dash for the finish line. This should make for more exciting finishes and less nerve wracking starts.

Of course establishing fair handicaps is the challenge, and to this end I look to our more experienced sailors to help in this. There are a number of ways of approaching this, including **Performance**Handicap Racing

Fleet (PHRF), or perhaps a golf style system based on accumulated average times. The various systems have their advantages and disadvantages and nothing has been decided yet. I invite interested parties to contact me with any suggestions they might have.

Additionally, I would ask that those wishing to participate in races this year to please send me the details of their boat, such as make, model and length. This will aid in establishing competitive groupings.
